

Women's Health Nurse Practitioner Program

Provide primary, gynecologic, and reproductive healthcare to individuals across the lifespan

Through a blend of asynchronous didactic content, synchronous class sessions, and in-person Objective Clinical Intensives (OCIs), the distance-based, online Women's Health Nurse Practitioner (WHNP) program from Berkley School of Nursing at Georgetown University prepares registered nurses (RNs) to provide primary, gynecologic, and reproductive care across the lifespan. Students develop the specialized skills and experience to treat and prevent illnesses as well as provide focused care in areas such as:

- Primary care
- Prenatal and postpartum care
- Care throughout the lifespan from adolescents to menopause
- · General wellness and preventive care
- Reproductive health care

You will receive dedicated support and resources throughout the program, which include:

- BSON faculty, many of whom are Fellows in their specialty, who foster your professional growth and development
- Clinical placement specialists and advisors who partner with you to secure clinical sites
- Access to Georgetown library resources, student services, and the Hoya alumni network

Having earned a Master of Science in Nursing, graduates of Georgetown University's WHNP program are eligible to sit for board certification through the National Certification Corporation's Women's Health Care Nurse Practitioner exam (WHNP-BC) have consistently achieved strong annual certification rates.

Admissions Requirements

Eligible candidates for the master's-level WHNP program must:

- · Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Have a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) or Clinical Nurse Leader (CNL) entry-level Master of Science in Nursing degree from a CCNE- or ACEN-accredited program
- · Hold a current U.S. registered nurse (RN) license
- Have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA and a 3.0 science GPA
- Have successfully completed (C or better) a college-level, three-credit course in statistics

Your application will include:

- · Professional resume or curriculum vitae
- Sealed official academic transcripts
- · A one- to two-page personal statement
- A live recorded interview
- Two letters of recommendation
- The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) if your native language is not English.

Deadlines for Admission

The Master of Science degree in Nursing program offers two cohorts per year. Georgetown University accepts applications on a rolling basis up to the final application deadline for each cohort.
